#### 1) Weekly Attendance update

The week before half term we had 4 classes above 96% which is the national expectation. Our Year 5 class was at 100% - well done. The average attendance from Y1-Y6 was 94.4% which is well below the 96% national expectation.

#### 4) Water bottles in school

A polite reminder that there should only be water in children's water bottles which they access in the classroom. We have seen an increase in juice being brought into school. This should only be in a child's packed lunch bottle and not in their water bottle. Please can I ask that only water is put into water bottles. Your support with this is very much appreciated.

#### 5) Jewellery

It is school policy that no jewellery is worn in school and I ask for full parental support with this aspect of Health and Safety. Jewellery can be a serious risk to the children's safety during P.E sessions, playtimes, lunchtime sport activities and after school activities. There are lots of opportunities for children to get jewellery caught which can cause nasty injuries. The only exception is a watch which needs to be removed for PE and Sport sessions.

#### 6) Play Park and Skate Park

As the nights get lighter we find that an increasing number of children, of all ages, use the community facilities after school, at the weekend and over the holidays periods.

May I take this opportunity to remind parents / carers that the play park and skate park are unsupervised areas of the community site. These areas are not the responsibility of the school.
